Officer Changes at Iron Workers Local Union No. 3

Iron Workers Local Union No. 3 regretfully announces the resignation of Business Manager/Financial Secretary-Treasurer Gregory A. Christy due to a promotion. Mr. Christy has accepted a new position as General Organizer with the International Association of Bridge, Structural, Ornamental and Reinforcing Iron Workers and will be serving as the new President of Great Lakes District Council. This promotion comes at an opportune time, as former District Council President Kenneth "Bill" Dean stepped into his new role at International Headquarters as General Treasurer effective April 1, 2018.

With a vacated seat, Gregory A. Bernarding has been appointed as the new Business Manager/Financial Secretary-Treasurer which took effect April 9, 2018. Mr. Bernarding has been a member of Local 3 since 1991 and has been an officer for the past 12 years. During that time, he has served multiple terms on the Executive Board and served as Recording Secretary, Vice President and, most recently, President. Since August of 2013, Gregory has also held the role of Assistant Business Agent North.
